

Canine Keratoconjunctivitis Sicca (KCS) is a disease of the eye found in an estimated 35% of dogs. Often referred to as "Dry Eye," symptoms include decreased tear production, discomfort, and potential vision problems. Studies suggest KCS may be caused by an inflammatory process that leads to the destruction of the tear production glands. Most dogs will require lifelong treatment with medications to relieve the symptoms of KCS.
